I know the pressures on your time, but I wonder whether something could also be arranged from Cape Town? For example, could someone perhaps spend R5 and send him a small Xmas tree and a few decorations? And a few gifts, however small they may be, would be a great morale booster. Perhaps also he could be sent a record of Xmas carols.

I am sending a copy of this letter to Sally at D.A. as I am sure she would be willing to assist.

If you find it possible to do anything, will you please let me know?
