I have just received your letter of February 1, and am writing immediately to assure you that I am taking up the question of Bob's health without delay. I was most distressed to read your letter.

What I have done is to write direct to the Minister of Justice telling him that, after seeing Bob, you have reported to me on Bob's condition and that there is cause for concern. I have outlined to the Minister everything that you write about, and have asked him to have it all attended to as quickly as possible.

I received the account for the children's school fees and am paying this without delay. You need not worry any further about the fees.

I was glad to hear from you and to know that you are safely back in Johannesburg again. If there is anything I can do at any time, remember -- as always -- that you should not hesitate to contact me.
