I have instructed my bank to stop payment on that cheque and now have pleasure in enclosing a fresh one for R44.05. If I remember correctly, this is for the first half of the year. I shall let you have a cheque for the rest of the year later on and I trust that this will be satisfactory to you.

Mrs Sobukwe and I discussed the possibility of the children receiving extra tuition in English, and she suggested that I ask for your advice. Do you perhaps know any high school teacher in English in Leribe who could give the three children extra tuition? If so, I would very much like to hear from him, and also how much he would charge.
