After a long silence during which I wondered what had become of you, I have been delighted to have news of you. I gather that you have had a tough time -- and I was deeply sorry to learn it -- but that things are now looking better. My best wishes to you for the future.

I understand that you did an M.A. on the PAC at M.I.T. As I am working on the same subject for an Honours degree (I decided to go back to variety so as not to waste the year completely, and as a part-time student at Wits), I am tremendously anxious to get hold of a copy of your thesis. Any chance of letting me have a copy? I would gladly pay for the costs of a photocopy, plus the airmail costs involved in sending it to me. Perhaps registered airmail might be best. If it can be managed, I would like to have the thesis as soon as possible. Will you let me know if it can be done?

I was in Kimberley earlier this week and spent two days with Bob, my second visit to see him since his release. He is fairly well, although still adjusting to relative normality. It will take a while. He has turned down a job offered to him in the town's Bantu Affairs Department, and is hoping to undertake his legal articles to qualify as an attorney. He spoke fondly and warmly about you. I know what your worries are, and I can assure you that they are unjustified. He would be delighted to hear from you. If you want to write, his address is: 6 Naledi Street, Galeshwa Village, Kimberley, Cape. Just keep it non-political! He is inactive politically, and it will remain so.
