CAPE TOWN.—Mrs. Veronica Sobukwe, with her four children, left Cape Town by train for Johannesburg at the weekend after a 14-day visit to her husband, Mr. Robert Sobukwe, who is detained on Robben Island in terms of the General Law Amendment Act.

Mr. Sobukwe, who is a B.A. graduate and former lecturer in Bantu Languages at the University of the Witwatersrand, served a three-year sentence for incitement, imposed during the Pan-Africanist Congress's anti-pass campaign in 1960.

### REDETAINED

He was immediately re-detained on expiry of his sentence in terms of a provision which gives the Minister the power to hold certain people after they have completed their sentence if they are "likely to advocate, advise, defend or encourage any of the objects of Communism."

Mr. Sobukwe has now been held on Robben Island since May, 1963.
