Dear Mrs Sobukwe,

I am glad to be able to let you know that I have been able to raise the money for your visit to Cape Town. Will you please let me know how much you need so that I can send it out to you?

The only difficulty is that I am leaving for Durban on Tuesday and will be away for about ten days. The best thing might be for us to wait until I return to Johannesburg so that I can come out and see you. Will you, in the meantime, send me a letter to let know what time of the day you are usually at home at present?

I have had several letters from Bob lately, and there is no doubt that he is keeping well. His spirits are high and he is cheerful.

In one of his letters he asked me to send you the list of his measurements, and I am enclosing this herewith. Bob said in his letter that he would like me to help you to arrange alterations to his grey suit. He said, however, that I should send the suit to him before any alterations are made, as he would first like to try on the suit. It might be best again to wait until my return from Durban so that I can collect the suit from you and attend to sending it down to Bob.

Please forgive me not having been to see you for so long. But I am afraid that this jail business has kept me under extremely heavy pressure, and I have not been able to give my friends the time that I would have liked to have given them.

In any event, I look forward to seeing you again soon.

I hope that you and the children are keeping well. Their school fees, by the way, have been paid so you need not worry yourself about this.
