Dearest Rob,

I spoke on the phone today to Dr R.L. AMOILS, of Kimberley, and arranged for him to give you a thorough medical check-over. Will you please contact him immediately so that an appointment can be made? I am most anxious to have a first-class doctor look at you. His address is: 4th Floor, UBS Building (i.e. United Building Society Building), Du Toitpan Road, phone 8138. I have asked him to charge his fees to me. If you approve, can you please ask him to send me a copy of his report on you?

I have also arranged for a Johannesburg psychiatrist, Dr David Wynberg, to fly to Kimberley on Saturday, June 28. He will arrive at 9.30 am and I have arranged for a car and driver to meet him at the airport and drive him to your home. (I have written to Mr Meyer to ask for a permit). So will you make yourself available at home on that day? Dr Wynberg will leave Kimberley on the 5.45 pm flight. OK? He's a good guy, and I think you will like him.

I arranged to take Veronica to the furniture showroom this afternoon, but overlooked the fact that I have a varsity seminar which I cannot miss, especially as I missed the one last week. So Jill Wentzel will meet Veronica and take her. I am sorry about this, especially as it means that I probably will not see Veronica before she leaves on Friday. I shall, of course, give Jill detailed instructions about the sort of furniture in which you are interested.

At long last you have phoned me! Thank you for your call yesterday. I was so happy to hear from you and to hear you sounding so well. Will you phone me at least once a week -- and if anything ever crops up, whenever you want to?

Those were a happy three days together last week. Time passed all too quickly. But I promise to come down again as soon as possible. It did not seem as though five years had passed since we last saw each other. I was sorry, though, about the irritations caused by our being in a racial environment. One day, perhaps... although you have rather more optimistic views about this than I have!

I have just remembered something important which I meant to ask you last week. I have heard that earlier this year, possibly in March or April, a Johannesburg radiologist, a Dr Lazar, saw you on the Island. Is this correct? If it is, can you please tell both Dr Amoils and Dr Wynberg about it?

As I told you on the fono, I have written the various letters we discussed, and will let you know as soon as I hear anything. Much love -- to you and the children.
