Dear Professor Miracle:

Pat Murphy spoke with you in the fall about our willingness to help defray some of the transportation costs of Robert Sobukwe and his family to travel from South Africa to Madison, Wisconsin.

It is my understanding that it is possible, as a result of a court action in South Africa that Dr. Sobukwe and his family will be allowed to leave South Africa in the next months.

If this occurs, I want to confirm to you once more AAI's offer to pay up to \$2,000 to defray the air transportation costs for Dr. Sobukwe and such other members of his family as can be covered by that amount of money. If you hear anything more definite about the possibility of Dr. Sobukwe leaving South Africa, please contact us immediately.
