My dear Nell,

Thanks ever so much for your note of 4th November, which I received on the 10th. You will observe, therefore, that there is a slight improvement in the efficiency of our postal services!

I had hoped to send you a telegram as soon as I learnt that you were landing. Unfortunately I do not read the Cape Town papers anymore and the D.F.A, our local paper, is singularly parochial. Thus although I expected you back by October I didn't know that you had arrived until I received your note.

How was the trip? Incidentally I appreciated the brevity - the Greek simplicity and brevity of your telegram on the occasion of my release.

Veronica is here at home. She resigned from the hospital. The elder children too, have just returned from school.

I shall write more at length in a day or two.

This is merely to inform you that I can receive letters from anybody, anywhere - except from banned persons. And, of course, the censorship continues. So we stick in our letters to the mundane and innocuous.

Please tell me about your trip. How is Leo?.
