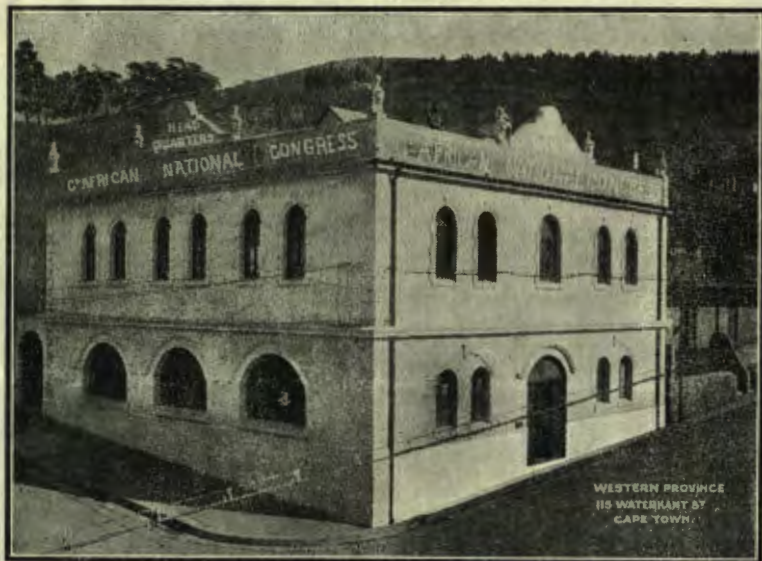

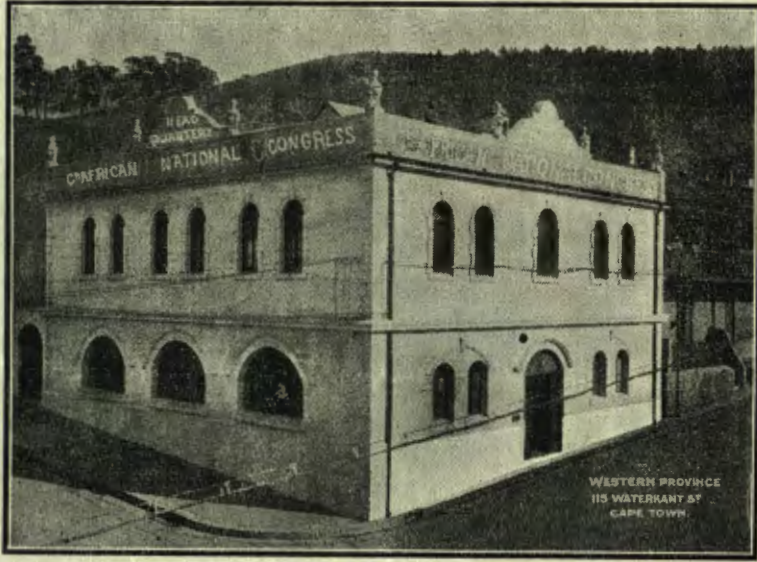

has been temporarily relieved from rup-
ture by local loans from few members
of Congress and few Indians. The
picture also is completed and we are
making some efforts to raise something like

shall be promptly forwarded to you. I spent
two days at Beaufort unexpectedly. Chief Man-
Kuroane also tried his best. The letter arrived
just about the same time with me.
