TERMS OF AGREEMENT RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHMENT
OF AN ASSEMBLIES OF GOD MISSION STATION AND INDUSTRIAL
TRAINING SCHOOL WITHIN TERRITORY OF CHIEF MONTSIOA'S
JURISDICTION IN BECHUANALAND, SITUATED WITHIN THE UNION OF
SOUTH AFRICA.

Be it hereby understood and agreed on this -----
_____ day of _____, 1925, that I, _____
_____ representing the people of the
_____ tribe, do hereby agree to allocate
a tract of land, situated approximately 5 1/2 miles Northeast of
the Municipal Township of Mafeking, (Exact location and area to
be agreed upon at later date), for the erection of a mission
station and industrial training school by The General Council of
the Assemblies of God of Springfield, Missouri, U.S.A., it being
understood that the above mentioned site and all properties erected
thereon shall be held in trust for the General Council of the
Assemblies of God of the U.S.A. by the officials of the South
African District Council of the Assemblies of God or by a special
board of trustees that may be appointed by said South African
District Council,

(2). I, Chief L.K. Montsioa, on behalf of the people of my
tribe, do promise to render every possible assistance in furnish-
ing free labor for the making of bricks and the erection of
the necessary buildings, etc.

(3). I, Chief L.K. Montsioa, do hereby promise to exert all
my influence to induce the people of my tribe to make donations
towards the expense of purchasing materials for the erection
and up-keep of the Industrial School and Mission Station.

In consideration of the foregoing agreements on the part of Chief Montsioa on behalf of the people of his tribe, The Foreign Missions Committee of The General Council of The Assemblies of God do hereby subscribe to the following article of agreement, said agreements to be executed by the officials of the South African District Council of the Assemblies of God as the duly accredited representatives of the General Council of the Assemblies of God of Springfield, Mo., U.S.A.

(1) To accept the allocation of the tract of land offered and to erect thereon the necessary buildings for an industrial school and mission station, buildings to be erected and necessary equipment installed as rapidly as funds are available.

(2) To undertake the education of all native pupils of the above mentioned school in general manual and secular occupations, and to conduct literary school classes, domestic classes, and subjects conducive to practical development of a good livelihood among the native people, and to carry on general religious work among them.

(3) To hold the mission site in trust and carry on all work subject to the approval and requirements of the South African Government.
