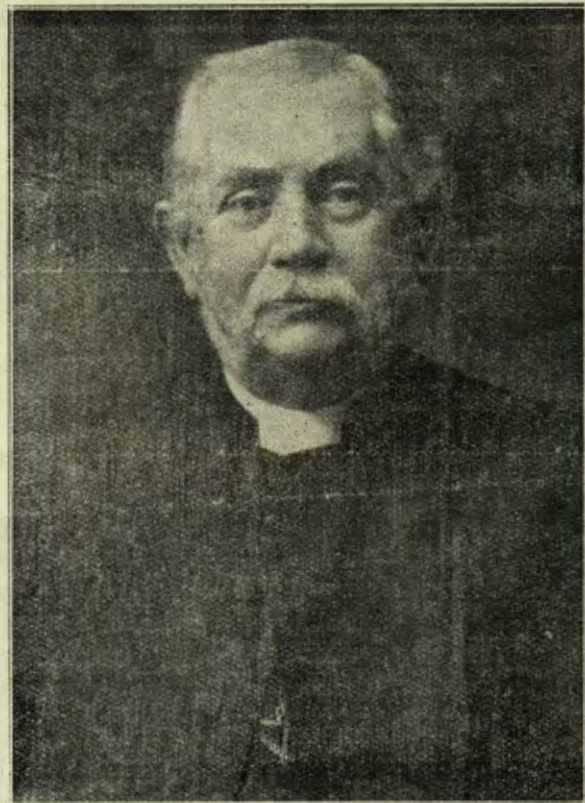

AN APPEAL

1. By resolution of the Synod of 1927 it was decided to commemorate the distinguished service of the Rev. A. Burnet to the Transvaal District by the erection of a Memorial Church at Kilnerton Institution.

2. Kilnerton represents the contribution of Transvaal Methodism to the great work of developing and shaping the life of young Africa. It is also the meeting place, every other year, of the Transvaal Synod in its African Session.

3. At the present time 220 boys and girls are in residence, 140 of whom are in the Normal Classes and the balance are preparing either for entrance to the Normal School or for the work of an Evangelist. In addition there are in the Primary School some 200 Day Scholars.

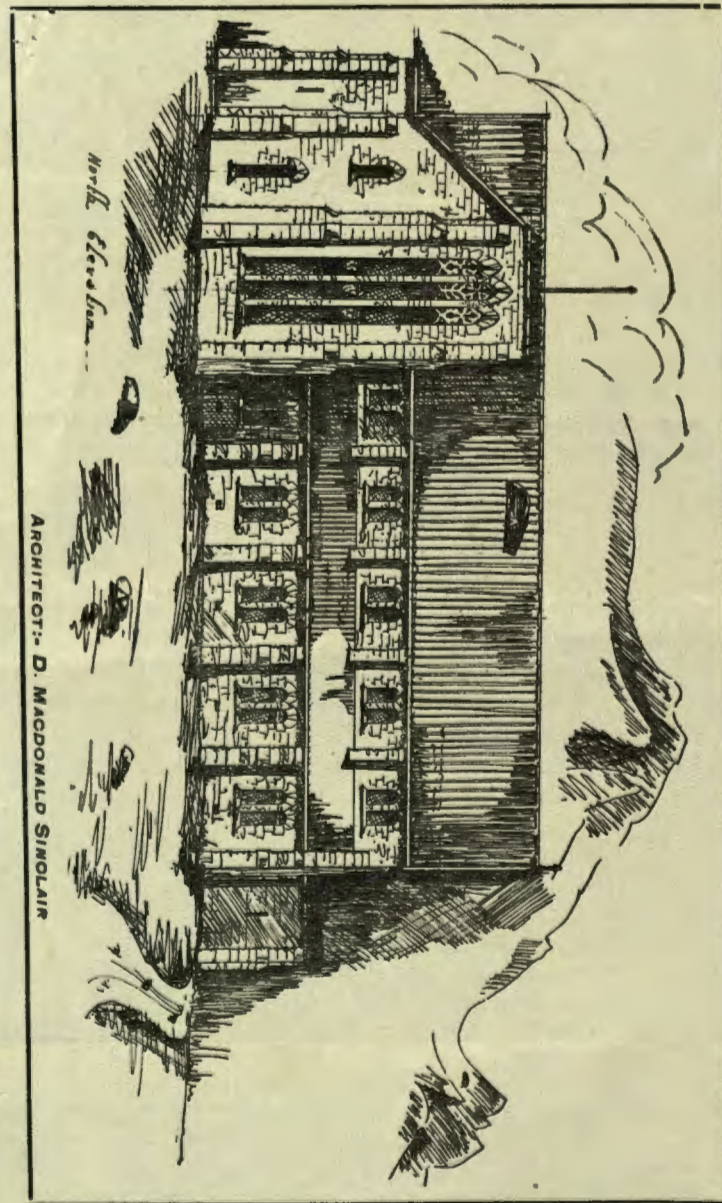
4. It is necessary to make Church provision for future extensions of our work, therefore the Church is designed to seat 400 persons, is to be built of local stone, the interior arrangements are to be severely simple and the cost is estimated to be £3500. It is hoped that the contribution of the Transvaal European Church will amount to £1750. The balance of cost we hope will come from our African people and friends overseas.

5. It is well known by Mr Burnet's friends that a Church at Kilnerton was to him a cherished project from the days during which he lived and laboured amongst us until his last visit in 1926.
